**Answer questions 1 - 50 inclusive on the answer sheet provided
TRUE OR FALSE**

- There shall be only 3 defensive charged conferences allowed in a 7 inning game.
- All players must wear helmets with two ear flaps.
- A ball is considered "outside the playing field" when it touches the ground, a person on the ground, or an object outside the playing area.
- A listed substitute may take the place of a player whose name is in his team's starting line-up, at the home plate conference, and he would then be considered the starting player.
- Making a fake tag is a form of obstruction.
- Home plate may be made of wood or rubber and should be a five-sided figure.
- The 10th position in the batting order is for the Flex Player for whom the Designated Player is batting.
- A defensive player must use only the fair portion of 1st base except on any live ball play made from 1st base foul territory. Then a defensive player may use the foul portion of the double base and the BR may use the fair portion.
- The ball is live when a thrown ball strikes an umpire.
- An ineligible player, once removed from the game, can be used as a replacement player.
- A pitched ball hits the ground in front of home plate. The batter swings and misses the pitch as it comes up on the bounce. The PU is correct in calling a ball on the play.
- The pitching motion is deemed to have started when one hand is taken off the ball or the pitcher makes any motion that is part of his/her wind-up.
- A substitute can be any starting player who has left the game once and is returned to the game as a re-entry into his original position in the batting order.
- All bats must be on the ASA and ISF approved bat list.
- The offensive team leaves 2 bats leaning up against the fence outside the dugout. A thrown ball becomes blocked by the 2 bats. There was no play on any runner at the time so the PU shall declare the runner closet to home out.
- Runners switching positions, after a conference, is considered an appeal play. The appeal must be lodged before all of the runners who switched bases are in the dugout or the half inning is over.
- Tie breaker situation and catcher is starting on 2B. The next 2 batters are put out. The coach is now allowed to put in a replacement runner for the catcher even though the catcher did not bat.
- A runner loses her helmet accidentally, while running the bases. An infielder, in possession of the ball, makes contact with the helmet. The defensive player is still capable of making a play on a runner. The PU makes no call and allows the play to continue.

19. A "Dead Ball" is ruled immediately when a BR steps back toward home plate to avoid, or delay, a tag by a fielder.
20. The umpires discover that 3B has been placed at the wrong distance from home plate. The distance should be corrected immediately before resuming further play.
21. An umpire may allow a proper appeal to the defensive team to achieve a fourth out in the inning, in order to negate a run that has been scored by the offence.
22. In adult male categories, it is legal to drag, leap, or hop and then throw, as long as the original push starts from the pitchers' plate.
23. With no runners on base, the batter-runner is awarded a base on balls and continues to run towards 2B without stopping at 1B. If the pitcher has control of the ball within the pitcher's circle the batter-runner is out.
24. R1 and R2 with two out. The manager uses a substitute player as a pinch runner for R1 but does not make the change with the PU. The batter hits the next pitch for a home run. Before a pitch to the next batter, the defense appeals that R1's substitution is an illegal substitute. The PU allows the appeal and no runs score.
25. An umpire who hinders a catcher's attempt to throw out a runner is guilty of interference.
26. After suspension of play, the PU calls "Play Ball". If one side fails to start playing within two minutes, the PU may forfeit the game in favour of the team not at fault.
27. The batters boxes are 3' wide and 7' long, 4' from the middle of the plate forwards and 3' from the middle of the plate backwards.
28. There are eleven (11) appeal plays in fast pitch. One of the conditions is that an appeal must be made before the next legal or illegal pitch.
29. An "infield fly" is a fair or foul fly ball that can be caught by any infielder with ordinary effort when there are fewer than 2 out and runners on 1st and 2nd or 1st, 2nd and 3rd bases.
30. Catcher obstruction is an example of an "Option Play" whereby the coach of the offended team is given the choice of taking the enforcement of the illegal action or the result of the play.
31. The ball remains live until the umpire calls "Time", which can be done when any fielder has possession of the ball and in the umpire's judgment, all play has ceased.
32. The BR overruns 1st base and clearly makes an attempt to go to 2nd base. He then decides to return to 1st base, slides to the orange portion of the safe bag and is tagged and ruled "Out".
33. An "illegal substitute" is a player who has entered the game without being announced to the PU.
34. The batter fails to enter the batter's box within 10 seconds after "Play Ball" has been called. This warrants a strike being called on the batter.
35. A batted ball is hit to F6, who overthrows the ball at first base. The ball hits the coach. The ball settles in foul territory. The PU rules a "Blocked Ball" and advances the runners two bases.
36. A player sustains an injury and is bleeding. He is withdrawn from play and the replacement player may act in his place for the remainder of that inning only.
37. All defensive players must be in fair territory, with the exception of the catcher who must be in the catcher's box, upon the delivery of a pitch by the pitcher.
38. On a single by B8, R2 is rounding 3rd base when he trips and stumbles to the ground. The 3rd base coach assists R2 to his feet and R2 subsequently scores. This run is allowed by the PU.
39. The pitcher throws a pitch that goes behind the batter's head, strikes his bat then lands in foul territory. Plate umpire calls "Foul" and rules a strike on the batter.
40. In running the bases the batter-runner rounds first base on the way to second, but while rounding first, runs 15-feet out of the base line on the way to second base. The umpire should call the batter-runner out for being out of the base line.
41. Only the PU can forfeit a game and call balls and strikes.
42. The PU is right to stop a game that he/she feels puts the umpire, players and/or spectators at risk.

43. B5 has a count of 1 ball and 2 strikes. B5 swings at the next pitch but the ball hits her hands and rolls into foul territory. The PU should signal “foul ball” and have B5 return to the batter’s box.
44. If two offensive coaches confer a second time in the same inning, the coach initiating the second conference will be ejected.
45. A cast that is properly covered with protective material may be worn in a game.
46. In Senior female categories, pitchers are allowed to crow hop to deliver the ball.
47. A substitute can be any starting player who has left the game once and is returned to the game as a re-entry into his original position in the batting order.
48. Violation of the re-entry rule results in the ejection of the manager/coach and the removal of the illegal re-entered player.
49. Bases loaded, two out, B6 receives a walk. R3 scores the winning run. In jubilation the players gather around home plate. The defense correctly appeals that B6 did not touch 1st base. BU is correct in calling B6 out cancelling the run. The tied game continues.
50. A batted ball that comes to rest on home plate is ruled a “Fair Ball”.



***Answer questions 1 - 65 inclusive on the answer sheet provided
TRUE OR FALSE***

51. Youth players are prohibited from wearing metal cleats.
52. During a live ball situation, a player becomes injured and in the umpire’s judgment requires immediate attention. The umpire will then call “Time”.
53. The line-up card must show the first initial and last name only in the order in which the players are scheduled to bat.
54. The bases are loaded. R2 intentionally interferes with F6’s fielding of a ground ball. In this scenario, R2 is declared “Out” for interference and the immediate succeeding runner shall also be called “Out”. R3 must also return to 3rd base and BR stays at first.
55. B7 hits a fly ball into the outfield towards F9. The ball hits F9’s glove as she tries to catch the ball and it deflects into dead ball territory. The batter runner has already passed 1B when the ball goes dead. The umpire should award the batter-runner third base.
56. R3, when B6 hits a pitched ball into the air to the outfield. R3 waits until the fielder catches the ball and then is gently tapped on the leg by the 3rd base coach. The umpire rules R3 “Out” immediately.
57. In the third inning F6 is requested to remove a necklace. F6 objects to this request and refuses to remove the jewellery. The umpire subsequently ejects F6.
58. R2. B4 hits a ground ball to F6, who moves toward the hit ball. R2 running toward third, goes outside the base line to avoid contact with F6. No call is made and R2 is safe at 3rd.
59. B4 is the on deck batter and is in the on deck circle on the opposite side from his bench. PU requests that he return to the on deck circle beside his team’s bench area.
60. During the pitching motion, F1 lifts his pivot foot, off the pitcher’s plate, then replaces his foot at the end of the pitcher’s plate upon delivery. PU calls “Illegal Pitch”.
61. Plate umpires and base umpires may correct and/or rectify any situation which results in the reversal of an umpire’s decision, as long as it occurs prior to the next legal or illegal pitch.
62. Batter hits a slow roller down the 1st base line. F3 picks up the ball, in an attempt to tag the BR coming down the line. The BR steps backward toward home plate, avoiding the tag and then continues on to first base. BU calls BR safe at first. This call is protestable.
63. Batter hits the pitched ball to F6, who fields the ball and throws to F3 for the out at 1st. As soon as the play is over, the offensive coach appeals to the umpire that F6 is wearing a trapper. The umpire agrees with the offensive coach and with approval of the coach nullifies the play.

64. R1, BR hits a hard liner to right field. The BR, a speedster, catches up to R1 and when the throw comes in from F9, both runners are standing on 3rd base. F5 touches BR with the ball and the umpire declares the BR "Out".
65. Defensive coach requests time for a conference. At the same time, the 3rd base offensive coach moves to 1st base to confer with his other coach, for a second time in the inning. The offensive coach initiating the conference will be ejected from the game.



**Answer questions 1 - 75 inclusive on the answer sheet provided
TRUE OR FALSE.**

66. B7 hits a long fly ball into the corner in left field. The ball hits the top of the fence and then bounces off F7 and over the fence in foul territory. The umpire rules "Home Run" and "Dead Ball".
67. With 1 out, R1 passes R2 between 2B and 3B after a legally batted ball. The correct call would be to have R1 out for passing, with the ball remaining live and remaining runners are still in jeopardy.
68. R3, B4 at bat. F5 is playing deep behind 3rd base. B4 hits a line drive which hits R3's leg in fair territory while he is standing on the base. There is no fence along the 3rd base side and the ball deflects out of play. PU calls "Dead Ball", as F5 had a play on the ball. R3 remains at 3rd and B4 is awarded 1st.
69. R1 leaves 1B on the release of the pitch. B8 attempts a drag bunt. After bunting the ball, B8 drops the bat over fair territory and the bat hits the ball. R1 had rounded 2B prior to the bat making contact with the ball. The PU rules "Dead Ball", B8 out and R1 must return to 1B.
70. With no outs and R1 on 2B, B2 swings at strike three, and the catcher misses the ball and it rolls out in front of the plate. B2 immediately moves to run to 1B and F2 stops to let B2 by before trying to pick up the ball. The umpire calls "Dead Ball" and the batter out for interference.
71. R1 with 1 out. The first pitch to the next batter is a wild pitch advancing R1 to 2nd base. The defense then correctly appeals that the batter is an illegal substitution. The BU removes the illegal batter from the game, rules him ineligible. The new substitute assumes the at bat with 1 ball and the runner stays at second.
72. R1 when B3 hits a single to right field. R1 is on his way to 3rd base when F6 steps in front of him slowing him down. The throw comes into 3rd and R1 is tagged out. The base umpire should signal "OBSTRUCTION" and signal delayed dead ball as soon as he sees it and immediately call "DEAD BALL" when R1 is tagged and rule him safe.
73. The batter hits a pitched ball on the ground to F5 who slightly bobbles the ball but still makes a strong throw to first base. F3 receives the thrown ball just ahead of the BR. The feet of both F3 and BR are on the white portion of the double base resulting in a collision causing the ball to be jarred loose from F3. The BU calls runner safe.
74. The count is two balls and two strikes. The batter is swinging at the next pitch and the ball contacts her hands in the strike zone. This is a dead ball and strike three on the batter and batter is out.
75. The ball remains live, when the batter is called out for stepping directly in front of the catcher to the other batter's box, while the pitcher is taking the signal, or appears to be taking a signal from the pitcher's plate.



**Answer questions 1 - 90 inclusive on the answer sheet provided.
TRUE OR FALSE.**

76. R3, R1, 1 out. B9 hits pitched ball that dribbles slowly along ground toward pitcher who fields ball and throws the ball towards F3 covering first base. B9, who is now running alongside of the three foot line in fair territory, is hit with the thrown ball while his right foot is just touching the three foot line. PU rules, "Dead Ball", B9 ruled out, runners return to their last base touched at time of the pitch.
77. R1, with no outs. The batter hits ball in the air above first base in fair territory. R1 runs into F3 fielding the ball. Umpire immediately calls dead ball. F4 comes over and makes the catch on the ball. There are now two outs.
78. There are two outs and the bases are loaded. The next pitched ball is called ball four on the batter. R1 advances to 2B, touching the base, and in the same motion takes two steps beyond 2B. F2 throws the ball to F6 who tags

R1 while he is off 2B. R3 has yet to touch home plate. The BU rules R1 out for being off the base and the run does not count because it is a timing play.

79. R2, 1 out. B8 hits a ball to the outfield where F9 fields the ball and throws it home in an attempt to gun down R2 who is trying to score from second base. The catcher is straddling the plate while waiting for the ball. The catcher receives the ball as R2 slides between the legs of the catcher touching home plate then roughly rises and pushes the catcher off his feet. The PU calls obstruction on the catcher, rules R2 safe and then ejects R2 from the game.
80. BR hits a solid single to right field. As he rounds 1st base he slips and falls. The alert right fielder quickly throws the ball to F3 who applies the sweep tag on the BR. However, in doing so, the ball comes loose and rolls into the dugout. The BU calls "Dead Ball" and awards the BR 3rd base, which is 2 bases from the time of the throw. This is the correct award!
81. B7 hits a ground ball to F6. Upon leaving the batter's box he drops his bat in front of home plate. F6 throws home to prevent R3 from scoring. The thrown ball hits B7's bat. In this scenario, the ball is dead and R3 will be called "Out" because this is a type of offensive interference.
82. The bases are loaded, with two out. B1 has a count of three balls and two strikes. The next pitch is swung at and missed as it skips off the ground and into F2's glove. F2 rolls the ball back toward the pitcher's circle, apparently thinking the inning is over. The batter begins to run to 1st base. F1 picks up the ball and throws it wildly toward 1st base. The ball rolls into right field allowing the base runners to score as the BR slides into 3rd base. F4 correctly appeals that the BR missed 2nd base. The BU rules that the BR is out. The umpires decide that since R1 had not touched home before the BR missed 2nd base that only two runs would score.
83. 1 out, R3. B7 has a count of 3 balls and 1 strike. On the release of the next pitch, R3 heads home on an attempted steal. The batter steps out of the batter's box and fouls off the pitched ball. As the plate umpire you immediately call "Foul Ball", and send R3 back to third base and B7 will continue her at bat with a full count.
84. In the bottom of the 7th inning, the home team is down by one run. There are two out, R2 and R3 when B8 hits a hard liner that F6 misplay hits him in the leg. The ball ricochets to the fence along third base line. R2 and R3 score as F7 picks up the ball. The batter who has strained his knee on the hit, slowly and painfully heads to first base. F7 seeing this, fires the ball to F3 who touches the bag just before the BR touches first base. The umpire calls "Out" and the visiting team wins the game.
85. At the end of the inning, the defensive player, F4 Davis, leaves her glove on the fence post beside the dugout. In the top of the next inning, R1 and R3, when the batter hits a line drive to F6. F6 catches the ball and attempts to put out R1 who is off the bag trying to return to 1B. R3 is also heading back into 3B. The throw is a bit off line and the ball hits the glove on the fence, sending the ball out into foul territory behind first base. It is correct for the PU to call, "Dead Ball", rule R1 out and place R3 back on third base.
86. With no outs, R1 on first base and B2 scheduled to bat, B4 comes to bat instead and grounds into a double play. Before the next batter steps into the batter's box, the defence appeals that B4 batted out of order. The Umpire rules that the double play stands and that B2 is also declared out for the third out of the inning.
87. R2. The batter hits a pitched ball toward F6 who picks up the ball and throws it out of play. R2 is awarded home and the BR is awarded 2B. The BR touches 1B and is standing on 2B when R2 misses home plate. The PU should allow a dead ball appeal on R2 missing the plate, once the ball comes back into play.
88. When an offensive player over-slides home plate, causing him/her to lose contact with the plate, (s)he is in jeopardy of being tagged out by a defensive player with control of the ball.
89. There are runners at 1st and 3rd with one out. A pitched ball is hit on the ground to F3 who fields the ball, touches 1st and then throws the ball to 2nd where R1 is tagged out. R3 had scored before the tag at second base. There are three outs and the run counts.
90. With R2, the batter hits a fly ball to right centre field. F9 calls for the ball but has the ball bounce out of his glove. F8 who is backing up F9 catches the ball before it hits the ground. The umpire calls the batter "Out" with the catch. R2 tagged up and left 2nd base when F9 first touched the ball and proceeded to 3rd base. The defence appeals to the umpire that R2 left early. The umpire should call R2 "Out" on the appeal.

LEVEL**V****Answer questions 1 - 100 inclusive on the answer sheet provided
TRUE OR FALSE.**

91. R1, R3, 1 out. The runner on first is off with the pitch trying to steal 2nd base. B9 swings at the pitched ball. The pitched ball deflects off the top of catcher's glove and goes directly to the catcher's chest and then bounces into the catcher's glove, where it is held securely. Umpire calls and signals a "Foul Ball" and returns runners to base they held at time of pitch.
92. R1 and R2, 2 out, new batter. PU makes the line-up change and announces a new batter. Batter hits first pitch to the outfield and as the ball is hit the catcher yells illegal bat. Runners both score and R1 picks up the bat and carries it into dug-out. Time is called, when F2 notifies PU that the bat was illegal. The PU goes to dug-out retrieves alleged bat and removes bat from game to. No other action is taken.
93. There are runners at 1st and 2nd. The BR hits a line drive with both runners scoring and the BR is heading for third base. The throw from the outfield comes in over the head of the third baseman. This park is totally fenced in with each dug out area having one gate to get into the bench area. As the thrown ball ricochets off the fence it rolls into the offensive team's dug out because the door to the dugout was left open by the bat boy retrieving the bat of the BR. PU rules "Dead Ball" and leaves the batter runner at third base.
94. In the 4th inning of a Canadian Championship game, the tournament supervisor decides the game can no longer be continued because of the heavy fog in the outfield. It is correct for the PU to stop the game based on the tournament supervisor's decision. The game will be declared not a regulation game and replayed from the beginning.
95. There are runners on 1st and 2nd with fewer than two outs. The batter hits a pitched ball above the infield. The shortstop and second baseman move into position, on the outside of the base path, to catch the pop-up. Due to poor communications, they bump into each other, causing them to misjudge the fly ball which falls to the ground in front of the two fielders. The ball bounces up and makes contact with R2 who is just off 2nd base. Two outs are recorded on the play.
96. There is a runner on 2nd base when the batter hits a single to right field. While the ball is in play, the on-deck batter tries to pick up the bat and remove it from the playing field but in a panic drops the bat in front of home plate. F8 throws the ball home as R2 is rounding third base and is heading home. The thrown ball hits the bat and bounces out of F2's reach. R2 proceeds home and scores. The BR ends up at 2nd on the throw. The PU declares a "Dead Ball" situation and returns R2 to 3rd base and the BR to 1st base.
97. With R2, B9 hits a single to center field. R2 heads for home but does not touch 3rd base. The throw from center goes toward home and R2 realizes her error and tries to get back to 3rd base when she is obstructed and subsequently tagged out by a fielder before she could reach the base. The PU rules "Dead Ball", obstruction, and R2 safe at third. The defense can now appeal that R2 missed 3rd base.
98. R2 and R3. The batter has a count of 2 Balls and 2 Strikes. An illegal pitch is called on the next pitched ball. The batter swings and hits a single and arrives at 1B safely, but on the ensuing throw from F8, R2 is thrown out at home plate. The PU enforces the illegal pitch rule, bringing the BR back to bat with a full count and scores R3 and places R2 on 3B.
99. The bases are loaded with two outs. A batter bats out of order and hits a pitched ball, clearing the bases. The BR tries to stretch his double into a triple and is tagged out sliding into third base for the third out. The teams' switch positions, but before a pitch is thrown, the team coming to bat appeals that the last batter had batted out of order. The PU agrees. No runs score.
100. The batter hits a pitched ball in the air to the deepest part of the ball park. The BU goes out and assuming that the ball will leave the park signals homerun. The BR sees the home run call and slows up going around second. The ball falls in fair territory, is picked up by the fielder, who throws ball to F6 who relays the ball to the catcher. The BR is called out on a close play at the plate. Since the BU's error put the runner in jeopardy he is put back at third base.
