



From those we will be looking at starting to bring new faces in as the UICs and Evaluators at the U16 girls provincials, Senior B provincials, Westerns that are in Alberta, and start you on a path that may have you being an UIC/DUIC at a Canadian Championship.

Keep your eyes open for when this application form comes out, and start sharing the knowledge you have gained as an umpire and teaching the next generation of up and coming umpires in Alberta.
